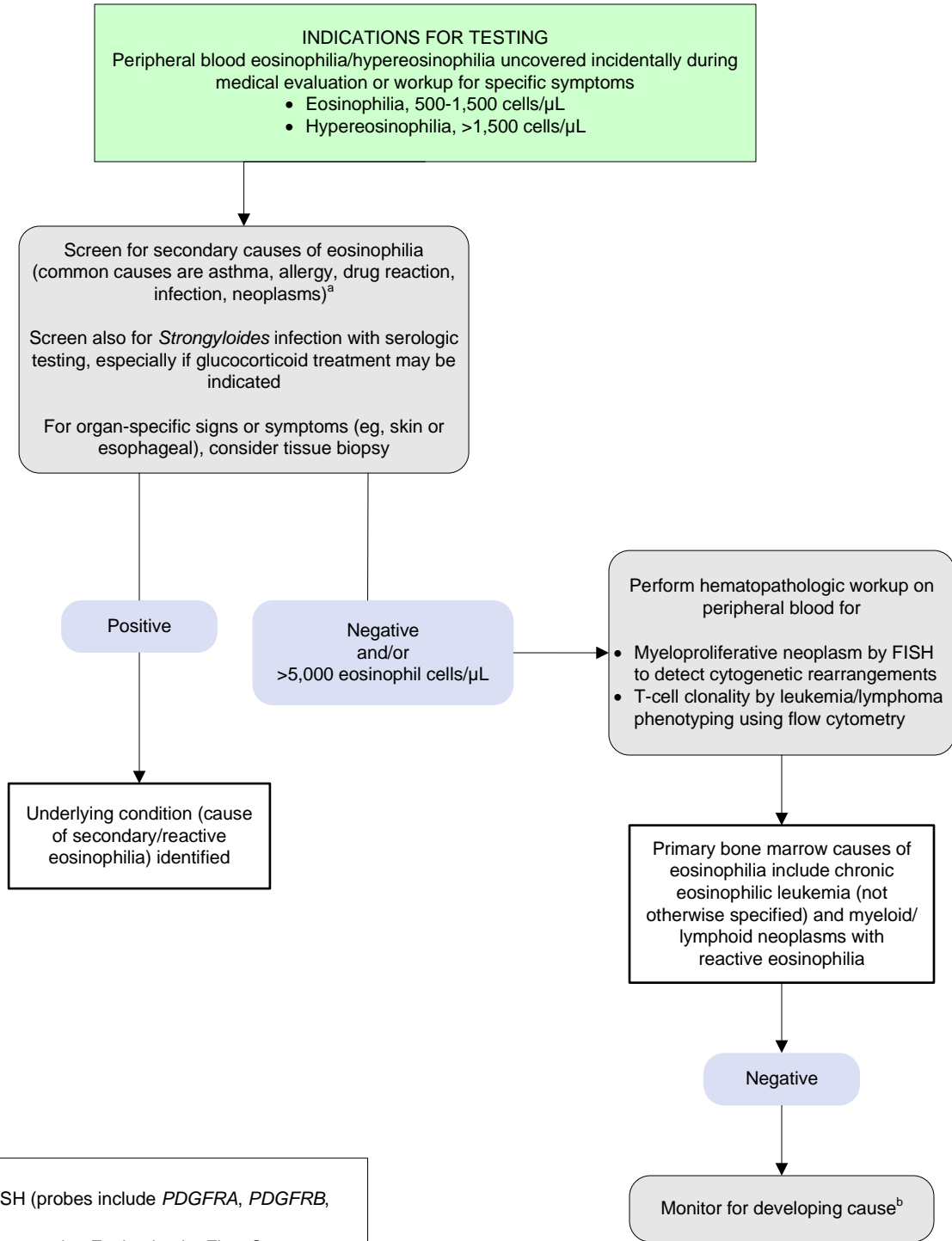


Eosinophil-Related Disorders Testing Algorithm

ARUP Tests

- Eosinophilia Panel by FISH (probes include *PDGFRA*, *PDGFRB*, *FGFR1*, and *CBFB*)
- Leukemia/Lymphoma Phenotyping Evaluation by Flow Cytometry
- *Strongyloides* Antibody, IgG by ELISA, Serum
- Eosinophil Granule Major Basic Protein, Tissue

^aEosinophilia from any cause can be associated with thromboembolic phenomena and cardiac disease as detected by, for example, splinter hemorrhages, nail fold infarcts, and/or cardiac murmur of mitral insufficiency.

^bEosinophilia/hypereosinophilia of undetermined significance (also called benign eosinophilia or idiopathic hypereosinophilia). Cause may be detected or patient may continue to have benign eosinophilia (or be deemed to have familial eosinophilia, a rare subset of eosinophilia/hypereosinophilia of undetermined significance).
